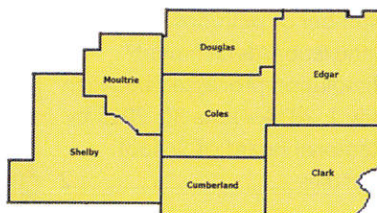

### Dear Friends of Education,

As Regional Superintendent of Schools for the counties of Clark, Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Moultrie, and Shelby, I am pleased to submit the annual report of ROE #11 activities from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. This annual report is designed in part to meet the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/3, 5/3-6 and 5/3-15.8. Our report should provide an overview of the services that we offer and also give you a better understanding of the tasks that our staff undertakes to fulfill our statutory functions and service commitment to students, parents, and educators.

We are particularly proud of the work we do within our alternative education programs. This year, Kyle, our alternative education staff, and I led a campaign to change the formula for Regional Safe School Programs that currently fund regions based upon total population rather than the number of students served. The inequities of the formula result in some of the larger regions getting more for doing less. We will continue to advocate for our students who benefit from the personalized opportunities that help them with their efforts to attain a high school diploma so that they may fulfill their ambitions of getting employment and becoming productive members in their communities.

Additionally, Kyle and I wish to thank our county boards, Regional Board of School Trustees, Professional Development Advisory Board, parents, educators and support staff who all work together to do what is best for our children. We are all fortunate to live in an area where there is exemplary support and dedication to providing quality education.
