Dear Friends of Education,

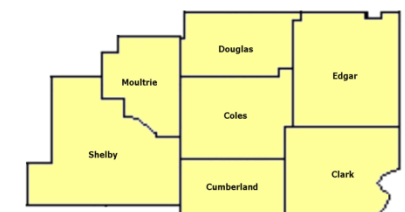
As Regional Superintendent of Schools for the counties of Clark, Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Moultrie, and Shelby, I am pleased to submit the annual report of ROE #11 activities from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This annual report is designed in part to meet the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/3, 5/3-6 and 5/3-15.8. Our report should provide an overview of the services that we offer and also give you a better understanding of the tasks that our staff undertakes to fulfill our statutory functions and service commitment to students, parents, and educators.

We are particularly proud of the work we do within our alternative education programs. Our outstanding teachers do a great job motivating and inspiring our alternative students to achieve success within a rigorous curriculum that meets the Illinois Learning Standards. This year, ROE#11 alternative programs served 204 students. Seventy-two of those students participated in our cooperative education program learning work and job skills resulting in many of them becoming employed within our communities. Over 90% of our alternative education students achieved academic success as indicated by graduation, advancement in grade level, or retrieving credits to get them back on track to graduate on time.
