

We have also hired a Special Education Regional Specialist through a federal grant who will work directly with special educators throughout ROE #11. Additionally, our office will continue to battle the teacher shortage by advocating for legislation and rule changes that allow for flexibility and expand our pipeline to fill our schools with qualified staff.

We hope the 2021-2022 school year will continue moving toward a "return to normal" as we all strive to do what is best for our students. Our office remains ready to serve. We know how important each school day is for our students as they grow and learn, and we will continue to do everything possible -- no matter the circumstances -- to help our schools provide the best learning environment for every student.
