The ACE Study: Then and Now for School Nurses

This workshop will overview the 1995-1997 Kaiser-Permanente research study, focusing on adverse childhood experiences (ACE). Recognizing the breadth of the study at the time it was conducted, attention will be given to what societal changes have occurred since then and what traumas have resulted. Topics including brain development, genetics, environment, and lifestyle will be addressed with resources provided for further study/discussion.

Differentiation in the Tier I Classroom

We are all unique learners. Knowing that differentiation is important to ALL student learning, differentiation in the Tier One Classroom is necessary. It should flow K-12 in the Tier One Classrooms with grade level to grade level instruction, practice, and mastery. Using pre and formative assessment will inform the planning and implementation of the lesson. This does not have to be time-consuming and extra work. Differentiation is just a new way of planning for all students to be successful that includes:

- Choosing Content (What is used to bring information),
- Process (How we teach information and how students practice it),
- Product (How students show mastery of the content),
- Learning Environment (How students feel and what they need in the environment as they are learning) .

Each of these four ways are discussed in this training along with strategies and ideas to implement. Come, interact, and enjoy four hours with peers. Differentiation is the way to reach ALL students.

Developing Skilled Writers in Grades 1-5

Research is clear - as early as 1st grade, students are learning to write and to read for writing. However, most of our elementary grade students are not thriving in writing instruction. We need to help our elementary grade students, especially those with disabilities and struggling writers, develop understandings of genres and the writing process; powerful strategies for planning, drafting, and revising; self-regulation of the writing process; and positive attitudes about writing and themselves as writers. Self-regulated Strategy Development (SRSD), is an instructional approach that gets strong results in each of these areas. Come and learn what you and SRSD instruction can do with your students.

Developing Skilled Writers in Middle & High School

Effective writing instruction at the secondary level is crucial for developing the writing skills of all students. Middle and high school students, especially those with disabilities and struggling writers, need strategies for completing the writing process for various tasks, audiences, and purposes; reading and writing to learn; and self-regulation. Self-Regulated Strategy Development (SRSD), deemed evidence-based by four independent groups, is an instructional approach that gets strong results. Come and learn what you and SRSD instruction can do with your students – and follow up with further support from Regional Office of Education #11!

Have you ever wondered why some students react in a certain way to some situations? It's all too easy to blame ourselves or others for our shortcomings and compulsions. But sometimes, trauma is to blame for inexplicable reactions and unhealthy habits.

So instead of asking ourselves, "What's wrong with you?" we should shift the question to "What happened to you?" Trauma is difficult to address, and sometimes we don't even realize the profound effect it can have even in adult life. Experiencing abuse or neglect as a child can change how we respond to stress and how we see the world.

In *What Happened to you?* by Dr. Bruce Perry and Oprah Winfrey, we will explore powerful scientific and emotional insights into the way so many behave the way we do. As a survivor of neglect and abuse as a child, Oprah has joined forces with Dr. Perry to advocate for trauma survivors. Together, they teach how those who experience trauma can address it head-on and find healing.

In this cohort, we will break down the Google Certified Educator Level 1 exam into smaller workshops while preparing you to take and pass the exam. Each session will cover different Google-related topics, including Chrome and Slides, Drive and Docs, Gmail and Calendar, Classroom and Meet, Forms and Sheets, YouTube and Sites, and finally, test prep tips.

Level 1 certification indicates a fundamental understanding of using Google Tools in the classroom and confirms standard technology implementation skills. Educators who pass the certification test will be able to promote their status with a personal certificate and badge. Certification lasts 36 months.



