

In August, several ROE #11 superintendents traveled to an ISBE meeting to advocate for local control on behalf of their school communities. Others made the trip in September. Throughout the course of the school year, I addressed the Illinois State Board of Education on five different occasions in an attempt to restore local control during the COVID-19 pandemic on critical decisions involving how our schools will teach children. Mask mandates and remote learning requirements shifted the focus away from what is really important: ensuring our children can safely learn together with their teachers in their classrooms. Today, I believe our strong collective voices for local control of our schools will make a positive difference for all students and families in our region and across the state.

You Tube sensation principal Gerry Brooks visited our region in October. He addressed a crowd of 700 educators in Mattoon for over three hours. As practical and funny as his videos are, and as famous as he is, we found Gerry (pronounced Gary) to be very humble and down-to-Earth. In 2022-2023, we will be hosting a Regional Institute Day on October 7. We look forward to seeing you there!

Illinois' educator shortage continues to worsen. Our statewide organization, the Illinois Association of Regional Superintendents of Schools (IARSS), reported in January in its fifth year of statewide surveys of schools that schools continue to struggle to find qualified teachers, particularly substitute teachers, and expect the pandemic will make the problem worse over the next few years.

Throughout the year, we expanded our educator recruitment efforts. While we have been aggressively recruiting teachers into the profession for several years, this year we made a concerted effort to recruit school bus drivers, paraprofessionals, and substitute teachers. We hosted several fall and winter bus driver courses in our office and went on a road trip to register substitute teachers in your communities.

Major construction projects and programming additions in Charleston and Mattoon, countless grants, including a district wide school health center in Paris, and plans to upgrade existing facilities in Neoga and Sullivan are just a few other major undertakings across the region this school year.

We hope the 2022-2023 school year will finally be a return to what matters most: educating our children, in person, together and without the fear of the virus and mandates and lockdowns swirling all around us as has been the case the last two years. Our children, families, dedicated educators and staff all could use some normalcy next year!


